Greetings in the name of Jesus; the Savior of the world.

The Gospel text for Sunday, February 25 in Mark 8:31-39 is a striking reminder of the contrast between the Kingdom of God and the autocracies and republics of the world.

The Apostle Peter had just made His Spirit inspired confession regarding Jesus, being the Christ; the Messiah. Yet in the next section, Jesus described His upcoming betrayal, crucifixion and ultimately His resurrection. I suspect that Peter hardly heard

the word resurrection at the time because he couldn't get past Jesus' news of His impending death. Jesus, forcefully declares that this is the nature of His kingdom. It will be inaugurated through suffering and death, and will be sealed by His resurrection. Peter probably didn't know what hit him. But as time passed, he would experience the power of God working through him for the rest of his life, culminating in his own death by execution. By the time of his death, Peter had a much clearer grasp on what Jesus' words were all about in Mark 8.

For you and I, we may find ourselves stressing out about the wars in Ukraine and Gaza, and maybe equally, very concerned about the upcoming Presidential and Congressional elections in November. We would like to see all wars cease. We would like to see sensible and principled people at the leadership helm of our republic. Yet whether world events calm down or not, or if our candidates of choice get elected or not, the Kingdom of God, which has no borders supersedes them all. Ultimately, God will guide and direct our steps individually, congregationally, locally, nationally and internationally continuously. He has promised to be with us to the end of the age, and we can rest assured that God keeps His promises.

To assume that life will be smooth and free of conflict is a faulty foundation upon which to build your life. God never promised us smooth sailing, problem free lives, especially if we follow Jesus. Following Jesus includes following Him through the stress, turmoil, and pain of life, along with following Him through the joys, the peace, and ultimately the good times. Jesus bore His Cross, and we are called to carry ours as well, whatever that might mean for you and for me. Yet, our crosses do not begin to match the intensity of the Cross Jesus bore for us. His Cross brought salvation history to its pinnacle. Our crosses draw us closer to God and to each other.



However, I am promised as you are too, that Jesus will be with us to the end of this age and beyond (the last two words are mine). In the meantime, we trust Jesus to grant us wisdom, strength, and an appreciation for the small and larger joys of life in the midst of the chaos which sometimes surrounds us. Trust Jesus and lean on His everlastingarms.
